Brackla Community Centre will be undergoing some much needed updates at the Community Centre this May. The centre will see improved disabled access, fire safety and other essential maintenance.

Welcome Café and Afternoon Hub

We have a welcome café and afternoon hub running Brackla Community Centre every Tuesday (during term time). Our café is set up from 10am - 12pm, where you can have refreshments of hot drinks and biscuits.

Build a better Brackla- "Love it, Don't trash it

We are continuing to develop the 'Brackla Love it, Don't trash it project and are continually grateful to residents actively pursuing our reduce it, reuse it and recycle it theme.

During 2023 we aim to set up a Community Hub in the area where residents can borrow equipment they may need to carry out litter picks. Brackla Community Council are aiming to set up organized litter picks in support of the excellent valuable work the BCBC Cleaner Streets Team and our own Contractor provide throughout Brackla.

In November 2022 ten new large green Brackla Community Council litter bins were installed in key locations throughout Brackla to supplement our existing 15 large silver bins. In conjunction with BCBC locations of all litter bins and requirement for additional bins will be regularly reviewed and your input in this matter is most welcome.

Additional Red Dog Waste bins have also been installed in several locations and their use is most valued in helping to manage the recycling of general waste. Again, additional needs and locations for these bins will be monitored.

If you have any issues with any of our Green or Silver Bins it can be reported using the "What3Words" App which provides us with a unique 3 word address which can also be supported with photos of the problem. Reports to:







Flower Displays and Grass Cutting

As we come into the Spring and Summer months, lots of new displays of flowers in the planters, roundabout beds and hanging baskets will be out in full bloom.

You will also notice that grass cutting will be commencing by our contractor and by other land owners such as BCBC and housing associations in the area.

A big thank you to our Flower and Grass Cutting contractors David Thomas and MS Property for their continued hard work, which resulted in winning the Wales in Bloom award again in 2022. We are hoping to enter the competition again this year and continue our success.

Brackla Skate Park & Play Area

The skate park was removed at the end of last year due to its age and condition making it no longer economical to repair. This had lasted around 23 years and was originally provided as part of a successful lottery grant bid together with funding from Bridgend County Borough Council. Alongside it there is also the basketball facility with floodlights and a small play area.

Work is now taking place to identify a suitable replacement type of skate/scooter facility in the same location, and it would be great to hear any views from residents and future users of such a facility. The basketball court and play area are also going to be refurbished to provide great new facilities for a range of ages.

This is being funded by BCBC along with £20,000 from Wales & West Housing Association as a contribution towards play facilities following the construction of 14 homes at Rhiw Cefn Gwlad.



Singletons Junction

For anyone living in Brackla, the dangers of Singletons junction will be well known. It seems that hardly a week goes buy without another minor accident causing major delays on the heavily used Simonston Road.

The need for improvements at this junction were recognised before Bridgend became a borough back in 1996, but none of the various plans over the years have come to anything. Today, after major development at Parc Derwen and at Wyndham Close, Coity, the road is busier than ever with even more accidents - we know of four just in the month of February 2023.

Your whole community council is united in lobbying Bridgend County Borough Council to make this junction safe for drivers, cyclists, pedestrians and other road users.

The two BCBC councillors for the ward, Simon Griffiths and Eugene Caparros are pushing as hard as possible for changes to the junction and representing you the people of Brackla. Last September we gathered information from you about accidents and at the end of last year we ran a public meeting where some of your shared your views on possible solutions.

We have shared all the evidence that we have available, and as a result, BCBC have agreed to start the process of change. However, as this is now recognised as a major route through the borough, a traffic impact study is necessary, and so we are requesting that this happens as soon as possible.

We are all determined to make this a much safer junction and so your continued support and information is much appreciated.

Badgers Brook Allotments

The allotments are located near Ysgol Bro Owgr, Brackla, CF312QR and currently hold a disabled gardening day with carers, every Monday from 10 till 3. Open to everyone. Pop along and help with seeding, meet new people and get involved. We hold open days and plant sales each year, normally starting in early May. Keep an eye out on social media for more information, all proceeds go back in to the allotments.

We have 40 plots on site, 30 on the main site and 10 on the disabled site. We have just finished our car park and will be starting on our disabled accessible activity shed, we are also looking to put in disabled toilets and are always looking for volunteers to help out on different projects.

When we have surplus veg we put it out to share so people can take it for free (or give a donation if they are feeling generous). We donate plants to schools to help with their growing projects and are always on the look out for plant pots of all sizes.

The next phase of infrastructure improvement is already well underway with both Virgin Media and BT Openreach installing Fibre to the premises across the estate – giving residents the option of ordering of ultra-fast, reliable broadband connections over brand new optical fibre cables.
